Incidence of Crime against Women during 2011

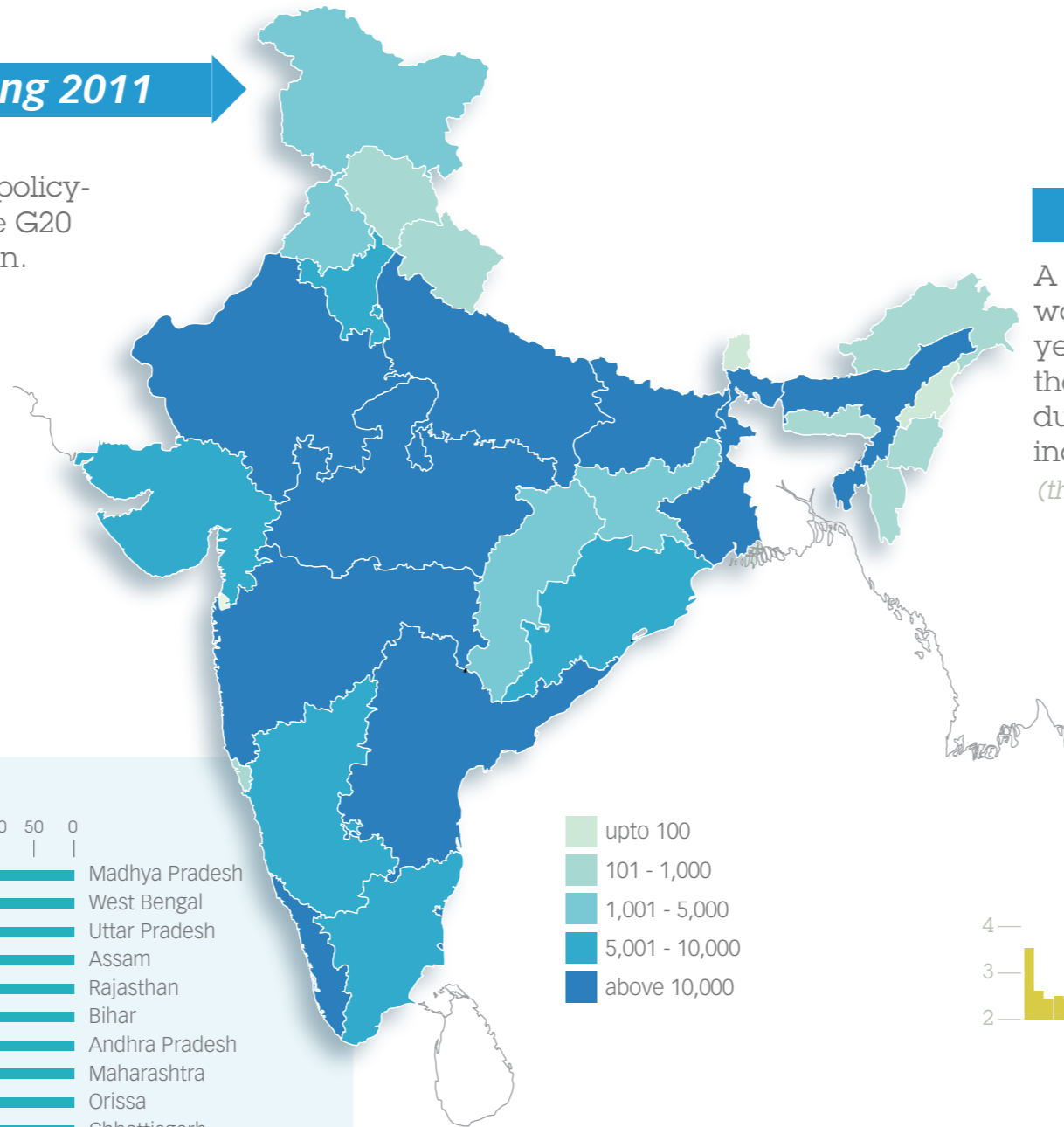

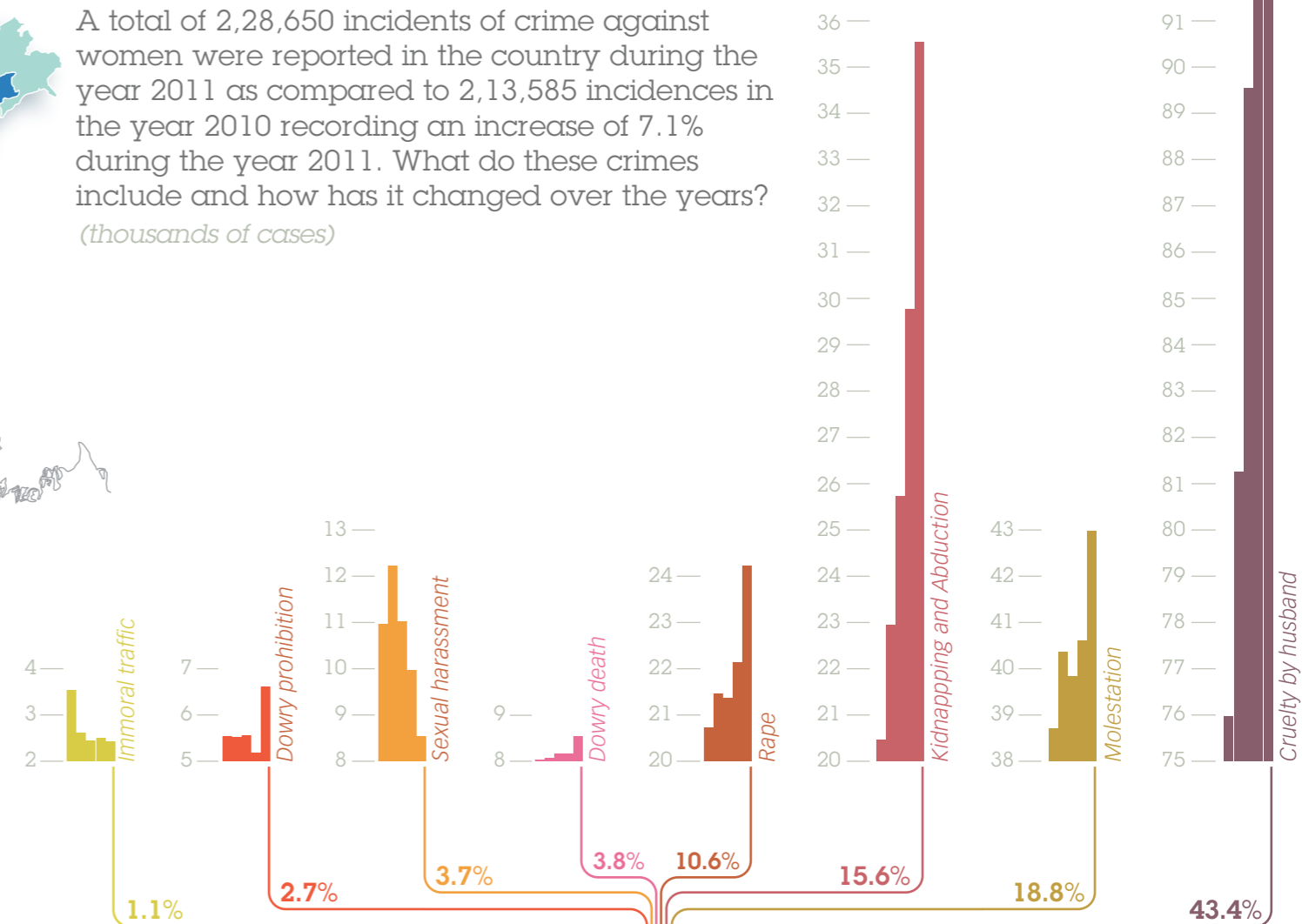

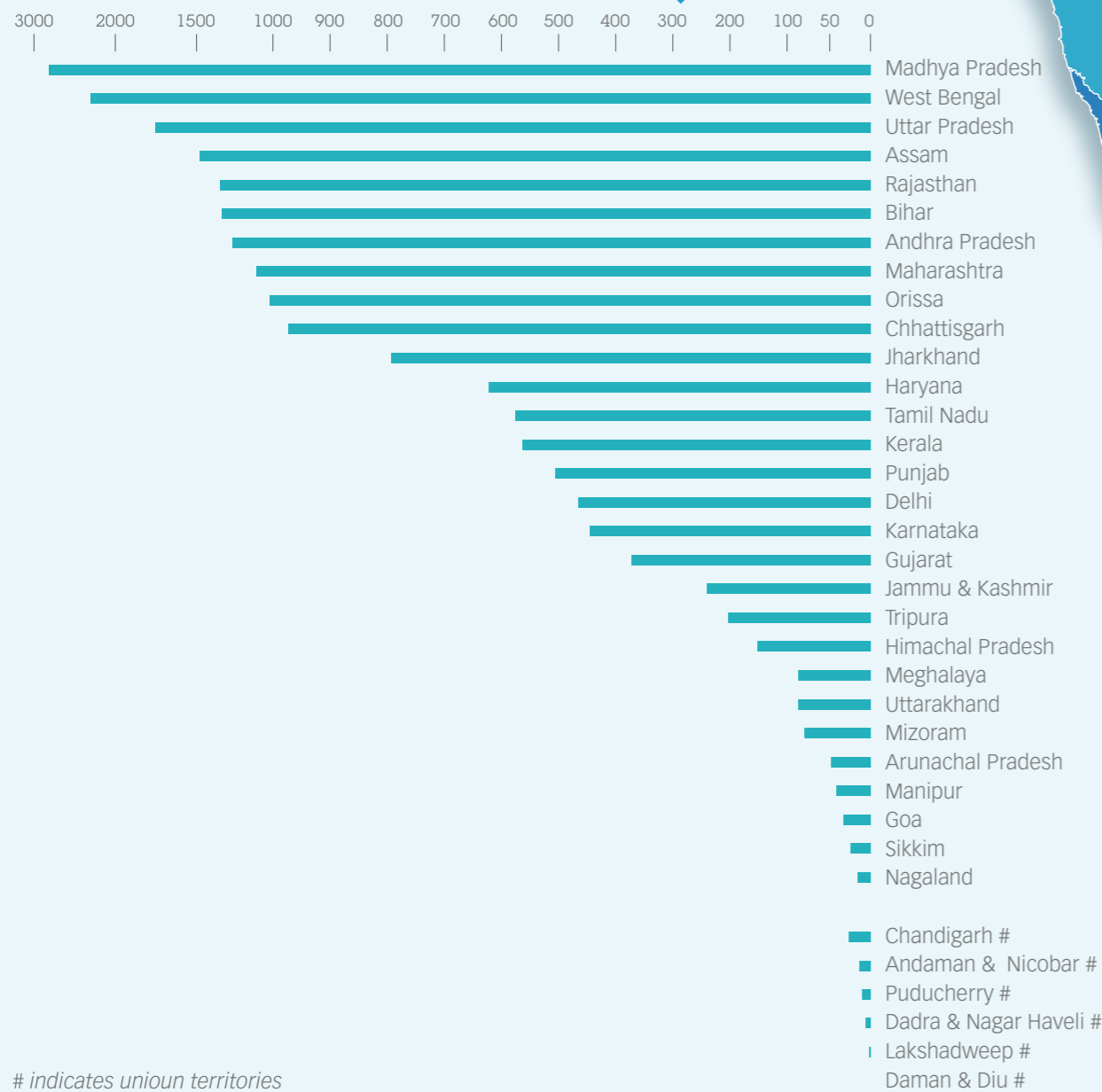


Breaking down the crime (2007 - 2011)

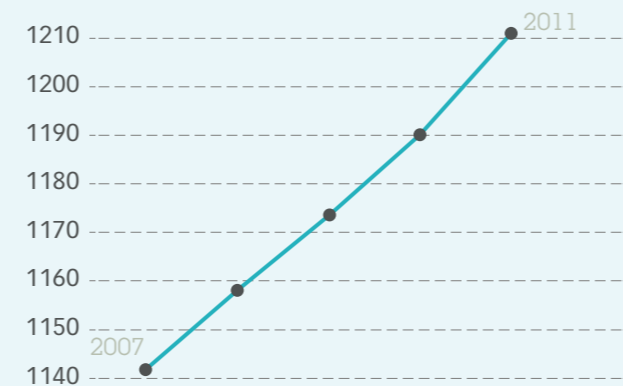
Rape cases reported in 2008



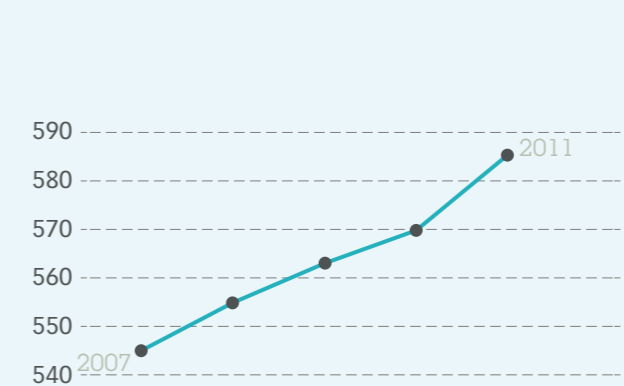
Crime cases relative to the population

Since 2007, the percentage of female population is constant around 48% but the percentage difference in crime is 7.1%

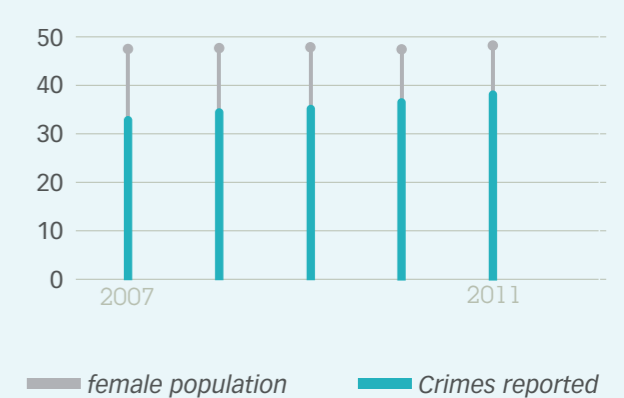
Indian population 2007 - 2011 (thousands of people)
